HALF MOON BAY, CA –SEPTEMBER 28, 2020 - There is no better place to celebrate the wonders of the fall season than along the <u>Half Moon Bay Coastside</u>. Fondly regarded as the pumpkin capital of the world, this beautiful coastal region, located 45 minutes south of San Francisco, produces more than 3,000 tons of pumpkins every year. The local menus are brimming over with pumpkin-inspired delights such as pumpkin cheese, pumpkin gnocchi, and even pumpkin beer on tap!

# 13th Annual Hand-Blown Art Glass Pumpkin Patch Oct. 10-11, 10 a.m. - 5 p.m.

Half Moon Bay Art Glass will transform the grounds of La Nebbia Winery into a glistening glass pumpkin patch featuring the work of glass blower Douglass C. Brown. This artistic installation

will feature hundreds of one-of-a-kind glass pumpkins available for purchase, each one personally handcrafted by Brown, who works year-round to create this spectacular display. La Nebbia Winery will be open for guests to partake in wine tasting. For those who wish to create their own piece of art, HMB Art Glass is offering several classes year around. ## 47th Annual Safeway World Championship Pumpkin Weigh-Off - LIVE STREAM ONLY Oct. 12, 7 a.m. - 11 a.m.

Pumpkin growers will gather to compete for the heaviest pumpkin at the annual Safeway World Championship Pumpkin Weigh-Off in the World Pumpkin Capital of Half Moon Bay. Due to the COVID pandemic, the weigh-off will not be allowing spectators/the general public to attend the event. Instead, it'll be live-streamed on <a href="#Facebook here">Facebook here</a>. In a pay-by-the-pound system, the winner will take home a hefty \$7 per pound for the champion mega-pumpkin. The Safeway World Championship Pumpkin Weigh-Off is offering a special \$30,000 mega-prize for the world record breaking pumpkin (currently 2,624 pounds set in 2016 at a weigh-off in Germany). Beauty will share center stage with beefy brawn with a \$1,000 prize awarded to the "most beautiful pumpkin." The event will be held at Long Branch Farms, 321 Verde Road. #### **Pick-Your-Own Pumpkin Patches**

An autumn visit to the pumpkin fields around Half Moon Bay is a popular annual tradition for many families. Spread out along Highway 92 (San Mateo Road) and Cabrillo Highway (Rt. 1), visitors will discover pumpkins in a wide variety of colors, shapes, and sizes in a beautiful rural setting. Below is a selection of local pumpkin farms open to visitors. *All farms will require social distancing and mandatory wearing of masks*. *Please contact each one individually for additional visitor regulations during COVID*.

- Arata's Pumpkin Farm in addition to pumpkins, this family-friendly farm features pony rides, petting zoo, a hay maze, and more. Playland will be closed this year. - Lemos Farm this family farm specializes in year-round activities for children such as pony rides, train rides, a petting zoo, bounce houses, and more.
