

PUMPKINS ABOUND ALONG THE HALF MOON BAY COASTSIDE, CA Enjoy Pumpkin-Inspired Celebrations, Patches, Beer, and Much More!

HALF MOON BAY, CA – AUGUST 31, 2022 - There is no better place to celebrate the wonders of the fall season than along the <u>Half Moon Bay Coastside</u>. Fondly regarded as the pumpkin capital of the world, this beautiful coastal region, located 30 miles south of San Francisco, produces more than 3,000 tons of pumpkins every year. This year is especially notable as it's the 50th anniversary of the renowned Pumpkin Festival. Visitors will delight in the area's brilliant orange pick-your-own-pumpkins and scenic backdrop of rich fall colors. The local menus are brimming over with pumpkin-inspired delights such as pumpkin cheese, pumpkin gnocchi, and even pumpkin beer on tap!

- PUMPKIN PATCHES -

Pick-Your-Own Pumpkin Patches

An autumn visit to the pumpkin fields around Half Moon Bay is a popular annual tradition for many people. Spread out along Highway 92 (San Mateo Road) and Cabrillo Highway (Rt. 1), visitors will discover pumpkins in a wide variety of colors, shapes, and sizes in a beautiful rural setting. Below is a selection of local pumpkin farms open to visitors. *For information about advance tickets and reservations, contact the farm directly.*

<u>Andreotti Farms</u> – in operation since 1926 this family farm turns into a giant pumpkin patch with an abundance of reasonably priced gourds to choose from. In addition to providing a bounty of vegetables throughout the year, check out the "You Pick Sunflower Field" to bring home a bit of Half Moon Bay sunshine. 800 Cabrillo Highway, (650) 720-0428, www.andreottifamilyfarms.net.

<u>Arata's Pumpkin Farm</u> – in addition to pumpkins, this family-friendly farm features pony rides, a petting zoo, and the infamous Minotaur's Labyrinth (a two-acre hay maze that changes every year). <u>Farmer John's Pumpkin Farm</u> – opening September 9, there's more than 60 varieties of pumpkins and squash to peruse at this famous farm. Visitors can also check out an authentic Native American teepee and take a ride on a vintage tractor. 850 N. Cabrillo Highway, (650) 730-9258.

<u>Lemos Farm</u> - this family farm specializes in year-round activities for children such as pony rides, train rides, a petting zoo, bounce houses, and more. From September 3 through November 20, the farm turns into "Halloween Palooza" with a haunted house, the Ghost Train, and of course, lots of pumpkins! <u>Pastorino Farms</u> – From September 15-October 31, Pastorino's transforms into a seasonal pumpkin farm with hayrides, train rides, ponies, a petting zoo, giant slides, and more. Head to <u>Half Moon Bay Brewing Company</u> for its famous Pumpkin Harvest Ale, available September 1 at the restaurant on tap and in 16oz cans. This Pumpkin Harvest Ale is a yearly fall specialty: a full-bodied Amber Ale made with locally grown Sugar Pie pumpkins and roasted with a secret blend of spices added to the brew kettle. The finished result is a subtle Pumpkin pie spice flavor balanced by a biscuity maltiness. Festive Main Street

Half Moon Bay's Main Street is a shopper's dream with blocks of locally owned boutiques, galleries, and restaurants. In honor of the 50th anniversary of the Pumpkin Festival, local artist Julie Engelmann has been commissioned by the City of Half Moon Bay to paint a large mural on Cunha's Country Store. The 40-by-30 foot work will incorporate images of local symbols such as pumpkins, artichokes, a beautiful ocean sunset, and more. To celebrate the fall season, Devlin Espeleta, a Bay Area artist, has hand-painted many of the store windows with cozy autumn scenes. On October 31st, the third annual *Trick or Treat on Main Street* invites kids downtown for the afternoon, where they can pick up a free trick-or-treat bag in Mac Dutra Park and collect candy from merchants.
