Make It Main Street (free!)

Now Through November; First Thursdays from 3 -7 p.m.

"<u>Make It Main Street</u>" is a collaboration of artists, musicians, and performers coming together to celebrate and promote local arts and culture while offering support to the shops in Downtown Half Moon Bay. This lively monthly event takes place along a few blocks of Main Street, spanning from Mill Street to Correas Street. HMB Pride Celebration and Parade (free!)

Half Moon Bay Ol' Fashioned 4th of July Parade & Block Party (free!) July 4; Starts at 11 a.m. – 3 p.m.

Get ready for a rollicking good time at Half Moon Bay's Ol' Fashioned 4th of July Parade & Block Party! Now in its 52nd parade year, this beloved tradition transforms Main Street into a festive celebration of red, white, and blue. The parade, a cherished homegrown event by the Half Moon Bay Beautification Committee embodies the spirit of Independence Day in small-town America. Enjoy floats, marching bands, classic cars, decorated trikes and bikes, delightful dogs on parade, youth sports teams, dance and theater troupes, and even a visit from the mischievous Pumpkin Festival mascot, "Gourdy." The parade will wind its way through downtown Half Moon Bay along Main Street between Filbert and Mill Streets. Embracing the town's western heritage, the event will showcase numerous equine entries, with prizes awarded in various categories. Adding to the patriotic ambiance, Half Moon Bay's renowned "Sitting Marching Band," comprising 40 members, will be stationed at Main and Kelly streets serenading the crowd with a selection of patriotic ballads throughout the parade. To fuel up for the festivities, the Half Moon Bay Lions Club will host its annual 4th of July Pancake Breakfast in the City Hall parking lot (501 Main Street) from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. Indulge in a delicious breakfast to start the day right.
