A special \$30,000 bonus mega-prize will be awarded to any grower who breaks the world record at Half Moon Bay, considered the "Super Bowl of Weigh-Offs." A host of veteran growers contend for the coveted title, the \$30,000 world record prize and thousands in additional prize money. In a pay-by-the-pound system, the winner will take home a hefty \$7 per pound for the champion mega-pumpkin. Superstar grower Cindy Tobeck's monster 1,910-pound weigh-off champion mega-gourd obliterated a formidable field of heavyweight contenders in winning the 2016 Safeway World Championship Pumpkin Weigh-Off. Perched on a cliff 20 miles south of Half Moon Bay, the 115-foot Pigeon Point Lighthouse and Historical Park, one of the tallest lighthouses in America, has been guiding mariners since 1872. During the 145th anniversary celebration, guests can enjoy live music, refreshments, face painting, native plant sales, grounds tour, and more.
