Located approximately 30 miles south of San Francisco, the <u>Half Moon Bay Coastside</u> is a vibrant coastal getaway ideal for outdoor spring adventures. With a temperate climate averaging in the mid-60s, visitors can enjoy relaxing walks along gorgeous beaches, go whale watching, and even hold baby goats at Harley Farms.

# TIS THE SEASON FOR...

## Whale Watching: It's Gray Whale Season

The annual migration of the gray whale is currently underway, and Half Moon Bay is the perfect spot for witnessing the journey of these spectacular creatures. Beginning in January and running through the end of March, approximately 15,000 gray whales swim south from the icy waters of the Arctic to mate and nurse their young in the warm shallow lagoons along Magdalena Bay in Baja, California. The full round-trip migration from the Bering Sea to the Baja calving lagoons is approximately 10,000 miles, the longest known migration for any mammal. Gray whales move at a steady speed of about five miles per hour, and most can be spotted in an area that extends from the kelp beds (about 3/4 miles from the shoreline) out to the horizon. For those who like to plan ahead, March through early April is a great time to spot humpback whales as they begin moving closer to shore.

#### Pilot Light Café Has Landed

The Half Moon Bay Airport welcomed <u>Pilot Light Cafe</u> in late January, featuring a casual menu of daytime options. Open for breakfast and lunch, menu highlights include avocado toast, smashburgers, and the signature dish - a golden Dutch baby pancake covered with fresh fruit. Diners will not only be treated to excellent food but also to up close views of the runway to watch planes take off and land. #### **Five Star Gelato**

<u>Gulino Gelato</u> has moved into a new (and much larger) location on Main Street. Their renowned house made gelato served in housemade waffle cones is a must-try in Half Moon Bay. There are a selection of rotating flavors each day - those lucky enough may get to try their signature strawberry basil or pistachio (made from organic nuts from a nearby farm). Be sure add a dollop of whipped cream, handmade with a machine imported from Italy. Recently added is a selection of crepes and bubble waffles.
